Rest of afternoon: Afternoon learning (History, Geography, Circle Time, Art, Music, RE, DT, PE and Science)
3:15 Home time



Our PE day will be a **Thursday**. Children will continue to **come into school in their PE kit** each Thursday. Children should wear black PE shorts/black jogging bottoms, a school PE top/plain white top and trainers. They can wear their school jumper/cardigan as normal.

Expectations for home learning...

Please see the home learning tab on our website for information about the purpose of home learning at Horn's Mill and why reading is highly valued. Team 6 will be expected to **read for 5 times a week at home** for at least 15 minutes. Alongside reading themselves, it would be **hugely beneficial if they listened to an adult read at home regularly**. Team 6 will also be expected to use **Times Tables Rock Stars** regularly at home to support their times tables knowledge and help them to build confidence with instant recall of their times tables. **Reading records should be brought into school every Thursday**. Team 6 children are responsible for writing in these (or asking an adult to write in them) and ensuring that they are in school on this day.

Children may bring home additional homework during Team 6 to support our English and Maths learning and to support our preparation for their end of year assessments (SATs). There will be more information given about these assessments nearer the time. Other ideas for homework and focus spellings can be found on our class page.
