Safeguarding Update – Icy Water...

If you find someone in the ice...

- Call the emergency services by dialling 999
- Let the emergency services know where you are. Accurate information can save precious minutes. If you have a smart phone and have location services or map tool enabled, this can help. If not look around for any landmarks or signs for example bridges will often have numbers on them which can identify their location
- Do not attempt to go out on to the ice yourself
- Tell the person to stay still to maintain heat and energy
- Try finding something which will extend your reach, such as a rope, pole or branch
- Throw the object out and, once ensuring you are stable on the bank either by lying down or having someone hold on to you, pull them in
- If you cannot find something to reach with, try finding an object that will float and push that out to them
- Ensure that you keep off the ice at all times during the rescue, continue to reassure the casualty and keep them talking until help arrives
- Once the person has been rescued, keep them warm and take them to hospital even if they appear to be unaffected


The junior children have learnt a new word recently...the word is "exhilarated"

Team 5 win this month for their attendance and early bird award goes to Team 1 for punctuality!




As you know, we work very hard to ensure that we teach the children vital messages about good attendance at school (in an age appropriate way) right from when they join us. I was recently sent this information that I thought may be interesting for you.

Attendance: the top facts to know & share The link between attendance and attainment is clear: In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders. And 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, also compared with 84% of regular attenders. And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance: More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years. But attendance is important for more than just attainment: Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.

We do understand that there will be medical appointments that children inevitably need to attend. Please can you follow the instructions below to ensure we are consistent in our approach to managing these:

- 1. Please try to make appointments at the very start or very end of the school day if a time outside of school hours is not possible.
- 2. Please bring evidence of the appointment to the office on your phone in the form of an email or text message for our records.
- 3. Please inform the office rather than (or as well as class teacher), as the office monitor attendance and the message from the teacher does not always get through in time.
