
Safeguarding Update – Allergies

It is coming to the time when hay fever will start to bother some of our children. There is no cure for hay fever, but the NHS offers the advice below. We are happy to administer anti-histamines in school if needed. Just let a member of staff know.

Do Don't ✓ put Vaseline around your nostrils to trap pollen X do not cut grass or walk on grass wear wraparound sunglasses to stop pollen getting into 🗙 do not spend too much time outside your eyes X do not keep fresh flowers in the house shower and change your clothes after you have been X do not smoke or be around smoke – it makes your outside to wash pollen off symptoms worse stay indoors whenever possible X do not dry clothes outside – they can catch pollen keep windows and doors shut as much as possible X do not let pets into the house if possible – they can carry vacuum regularly and dust with a damp cloth pollen indoors buy a pollen filter for the air vents in your car and a vacuum cleaner with a HEPA filter try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if you have a high temperature or you do not feel well enough to do your normal activities **"BUILD your VOCABULARY"** The junior children have learnt a new word recently... the word is "Cordial" This means warm, welcoming and friendly, but formal and polite Children in Team 3-6 have been trying hard to use it.

And finally...


